Fr. Pat writes: " One of the highlights on the Spirituality Experience with sixteen other priests from our Diocese last week was the visit to Taizé in the Burgundy district of France. Taizé is a monastic community consisting of over 100 brothers from different Christian traditions worldwide, where there is a strong focus on community prayer and living. You may be familiar with the Taizé chants that lead to silence in our prayer. We had a beautiful experience of this during midday prayer, together with 800 young people. In his Pastoral Letter on Holy Communion last Sunday, Bishop Mark reminded us of the value of silence in the moments leading up to the reception of Holy Communion and during that precious time of thanksgiving and adoration afterwards. Over the next two weeks, close on 100 children from our Parish will celebrate the Reception of First Holy Communion. In recent decades there has been an over-emphasis on the cultural and social aspect of this celebration much to the neglect of the Spiritual. In this Year of the Eucharist it is timely for all us to rediscover the true meaning of HOLY COMMUNION. Let us rejoice with and pray for our children at this special time in their lives".
