Fr. Pat writes: Today is known as 'Divine Mercy Sunday - Feast of Mercy'. It is celebrated throughout the Catholic world on the Second Sunday of Easter since the canonisation of St. Faustyna Kowalska, 30th April 2000, a Polish nun who died in 1938 about a year before the outbreak of World War II. In the words of St. John Paul II: *mercy is love's second name*. It's a particular kind of love, a particular mode of love when it encounters suffering, poverty, brokenness, and sin. Divine Mercy is when God's love meets us and helps us in the midst of our suffering and sin. Pope Francis gives that lovely analogy of a father picking up a child learning to walk when it falls down after taking a few steps. The hand that picks us up to put us back on our feet again is Mercy. God never tires of picking us up when we fall down.

It's our privilege to host the Divine Mercy celebrations this year for the 3 parishes comprising our Local Missionary Area: St. Vincent's, Holy Angels and ourselves. An occasion such as this is deserving of your presence in offering hospitality and witnessing to a world so in need of God's mercy and love. You will find details of the afternoon's programme in the newsletter.

The image of the Divine Mercy is what Jesus told St. Faustyna to paint as He looked when He appeared to her. You can see from the picture in our Church Jesus's right hand is raised in blessing, also He is taking a step towards us. Two rays of light issue from his heart: a red ray and a pale ray, representing the blood and water that gushed forth from His pierced side as He hung from the Cross. At the bottom of the image, Jesus wanted a prayer to be written: Jesus, I trust in You.

You will find copies of the Novena and chaplet prayers in the Church. You are encouraged to pray it should you not be accustomed to. Personally, I started praying it daily some years ago. I find these words in the conclusion prayer very reassuring: in difficult moments not to become despondent or to lose hope.

CELEBRATION OF DIVINE MERCY: Today our church will be open from 1.30pm with Confessions and Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament from 2pm. The Divine Mercy Chaplet will be prayed at 3pm followed by the Holy Mass celebrated at 3.30pm. After Mass everyone is welcome for refreshments and film (*Johnny*) in the parish hall. **For more information, please check poster in the porch**.
